As you may be aware, there has been a small rise in the number of incidents of anti-social behaviour reported to Police in the local area over recent weeks.

We consider it part of our role to encourage students to keep themselves safe and to be responsible members of the community.

To reinforce this message, all pupils attended an assembly on Thursday 8th February about knife crime, car crime and malicious communications on social media. The assembly was delivered by team EPIC and representatives from South Yorkshire Police and it contained factual information on crimes and the sometimes lifelong consequences they have for both victims and perpetrators. This will be followed by a second assembly called 'Crime and Consequence' immediately after the half term break.

We know you will be keen to join us in wanting to protect our young people from injury or from becoming involved in activities which may affect their futures and would be grateful if you could support us in reminding students of the things they can do to stay safe.
